Announcing the MKARL Fund in honor of Michael Krauss

The Endangered Language Fund (ELF), like the rest of the linguistics community, is saddened by the recent loss of Dr. Michael Krauss of the University of Alaska, Fairbanks. He was a driving force in the Alaska Native Language Center (now Archive), and a much-needed voice for endangered languages world-wide. ELF has received a pledge for a new initiative, the Michael Krauss Archiving and Revitalization Legacy (MKARL).
